Feast of the Presentation of the Lord



The History:

According to Jewish law, the firstborn male child belonged to God, and the parents had to "buy him back" on the 40th day after his birth, by offering a sacrifice of "a pair of turtledoves, or two young pigeons" in the temple (thus the "presentation" of the child). On that same day, the mother would be ritually purified.

Mary and Joseph kept this law, even though, since Mary remained a virgin after the birth of Christ, she would not have had to go through ritual purification.

When Christ was presented in the temple, there was a man in Jerusalem named Simeon. When Mary and Joseph brought Christ to the temple, Simeon embraced the Child and prayed the Canticle of Simeon: "Now thou dost dismiss thy servant, O Lord, according to thy word in peace; because my eyes have seen thy salvation, which thou hast prepared before the face of all peoples: a light to the revelation of the Gentiles, and the glory of thy people Israel"

By the 11th century, inspired the words of the canticle -"a light to the revelation of the Gentiles"- the custom had developed in the West of blessing candles on the Feast of the Presentation. The candles were then lit, and a procession took place through the darkened church while the Canticle of Simeon was sung. Because of this, the feast also became known as Candlemas. Candlemas is still an important feast in many European countries.



The Presentation of the Lord in the Temple

This is a wonderful feast with powerful readings that normally are only appreciated by weekday Mass-goers. The procession and candles offer an opportunity for parishioners to take part actively and so be more receptive to the theme of the feast- Christ who is the light who comes to enlighten the Gentiles, comes into the Temple, and is recognised as the salvation of Israel. This is really another epiphany- a revelation of Christ to his people. It is significant that those to whom he is revealed- Simeon and Anna- are both very old and have been faithfully waiting. Their years of waiting and prayer make them able to recognise who it is who comes to them. That is an encouragement to many who spend time faithfully at prayer, especially those who are in their later years; and note that Simeon proclaims presence this loudly, while Anna 'spoke of the child to all who looked forward to the deliverance of Israel.' Their prayer bears fruit in the revelation of the Christ and their reaction is to proclaim the Good News to others- they become evangelists.

It is worth noting how careful Luke is to mention that Jesus' parents are fulfilling the Law- it is mentioned three times in today's gospel. Luke wants his Jewish hearers to know that Jesus is in continuity with the traditions of Israel, and his Roman hearers to know that this person is no radical law breaker. Luke is always at pains to ensure that no one gets a distorted impression of Jesus, writing as he was at a time of great political upheaval.
